PROGRAM SYNOPSIS:

Robby Scucchi, director of volunteers at [Methodist Specialty Care Center](#), hosted Mississippi DOVIA on May 17. One of Robby's 93 active volunteers is Mrs. Anita Bonar, a pet therapist whose dog, Trigger, is certified through [Therapy Dogs International](#). Mrs. Bonar has been a pet therapist for 4 years. Therapy dogs must pass 15 "tests" including sitting quietly for petting, walking through a crowd, ignoring distractions (including food and other items on the floor) and reacting well to children and loud noises. Says Mrs. Bonar: "Sharing my time is the most important thing; pet therapy is the most enjoyable thing I've ever done!"
