Joanna Puddister-King, DOVIA President (Good Samaritan Center): Welcomed everyone and expressed DOVIA's appreciation for The Mustard Seed for hosting us. Good Samaritan is busy with planning and implementing all of their upcoming events and operations. Joanna reminded everyone of their Christmas Program and that they are currently screening low income families. This will continue all the way through November, so you are welcome to refer families to them. Good Samaritan is also planning their holiday races for November 12, which is one of the largest races in the city.
